
The show 'that runs itself' has yet again proved that. Personally, I'm looking forward to the future and to the 40th Autumn Sports Classic.



Many excellent cars were on the field that were worthy of awards. Our show draws some of the nicest cars in Western NY.



















MOWOG???

Have you ever seen the **MOWOG** inscription on you engine block, transmission, cylinder head or other parts on your MG?

Have you ever wondered what it stands for? Well, the research I have done shows that this foundry mark is still somewhat inconclusive, as you'll see.

Historically, MOWOG precedes the BMC merger. We also know that the MG came from the Morris Garages in Oxford and was later built in Abington.

Perhaps it stands for "Motor On With Our Guarantee"

Or maybe, "My Only Way Out Guaranteed"

Or: "MOrris WOrks Garages", or "Minis Of Windsor Owners Group"

Well, I believe the mystery has been solved. The Morris Garages, as it was called, later became the Morris -Wolseley Garages. Special cars developed from this garage were called Morris-Wolseley Special. Being an awkward and long name the foundry started to use the MOWOG mark for MG's as well as other Austin products. You see the MOWOG on many British cars, not just MG's. So the use of M was not likely use the M from MG. But there is a connection. We all know that the MG brand came from Morris Garage so it is thought that the MO in MOWOG comes from the MO in Morris. After all, the roots of MG go back to a garage owned by William Morris and later with the direction of Cecil Kimber the standard Morris cars were modified and the MG brand was born.

But what about the rest, where did the **WO** and **G** come from.

Well, if you recall, there was another player in the British car parts supply chain and that company was Wolseley. Before the merger with Morris Motors in 1935, Wolseley and MG were owned as the personal property of Lord Nuffield. After the merger, the identification number for chassis and engines on Wolseley was assigned a "WO" and the letter "G" was assigned to MG (M was already assigned to Morris).

Now there are two schools of thought that argue that the last letter G represents Group or perhaps **G**arage or even Grainge. Whatever the real answer you can be assured if you see the letters **MOWOG** it's British and you're sure to find its inscription pressing through the paint on your car.



Useful as a pet name:

Have you considered using MOWOG, Morris or Wolseley as a pet name. Others have. I'm enticed by Morris myself. I think if I ever get a cat I will name it Morris. After all, a friend of mine has two Yorkies; one is Ferrari and the other Lotus—Funny


